Youth Ministry

Story | Find a quiet place to read.

Read: John 10:1-10: 1"Very truly I tell you Pharisees, anyone who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. 2 The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. 3 The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. 4 When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice. 5 But they will never follow a stranger; in fact, they will run away from him because they do not recognize a stranger's voice." 6 Jesus used this figure of speech, but the Pharisees did not understand what he was telling them.

7 Therefore Jesus said again, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. 8 All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. 9 I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved.[a] They will come in and go out, and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.

Wondering Question

For you to think about first, and then to ask your family: Why would this story be so important that generations of Christians passed it on and eventually wrote it down? What was it about this story that spoke to them? Who might you connect with in the story?

Club 56

Story | Read the text out loud with a Bible and then read the summary together.

READ: Ephesians 2: 8-9 Paul's pronouncement that grace was given, not earned, was momentous.. The good that we accomplish is a result of what God has done for us. Doing good stuff is not the means of our salvation, no matter how great we may sometimes appear. Doing good is in response to our salvation.

Connection Questions

- What is the best gift you've ever received? What about the best gift you've ever given?
- Would you rather earn something or receive it as a gift? Why?
- Do you think anyone is too evil to receive the gift of God's grace? Why or why not?

Practice: Sometimes a gift is harder to receive than to give. Have each member of your family five a gift to the other this week --- a kind word or a chore done joyfully. Practice saying, "Thanks be to God!" in response.
